ANTERIOR SYNECHIA (sin-nee'-kia)

Anterior synechiae are abnormal adhesions formed from the iris (the colored portion of the eye) and the peripheral cornea, which is the clear front window of the eye. There are many possible causes of anterior synechiae including trauma, glaucoma, enlarging cataracts, inflammation within the eye and others.

These adhesions may form a partial occlusion of the angular portion of the anterior eye. This angle is the site of normal fluid outflow. Such a blockage in this angle increases the risk of glaucoma, causing potential vision damage due to a fluid pressure increase within the eye. Treatment consists of attempting to minimize further formation of anterior synechiae.
