CHALAZION

Chalazia are chronic, sterile inflammations of the oil glands in the eyelid margin. This common inflammation is a result of a blockage of the oil gland retaining its normal oil secretion. Chalazia may become large and can be associated with some localized pain, redness and tenderness.

To treat this condition, an eyelid scrub procedure, hot compresses and an eyelid massage are generally recommended. In some cases, a topical antibiotic ointment may also be commended. Surgical intervention, to excise the lesion, may become necessary if efforts to unblock the oil gland duct are unsuccessful. Please notify my office if your symptoms persist three to four weeks following the initiation of treatment.
