CONJUNCTIVAL CHEMOSIS

The conjunctiva is a thin, clear layer of tissue that covers the white portion of the eye as well as the inside of the upper and lower eyelids. Conjunctival chemosis is a dramatic swelling of this clear tissue. The appearance of this swelling is often quite frightening since there appears to be large bubbles of fluid on the surface of the eye. In some instances, this swelling may prevent the eyelids from closing completely. Typically, this inflammation is the result of an acute allergic response and is resolved without any damage to the eye or loss of vision.

As the treatment of conjunctival chemosis proceeds, the inflammation will be reduced. However, the tissue that has been stretched by the initial inflammation may take several days to shrink back to its normal size. The initial presentation of bulging tissue may go through a transition of a wrinkled/loose tissue phase before returning to a more normal appearance.
