CORNEAL ENDOTHELIAL DYSTROPHY

Corneal endothelial dystrophies are disorders involving the innermost layer of the front portions of the eye, the cornea. This dysfunction of the cornea may result in the corneal thickening, corneal cloudiness, and decreased vision over time. Glare and blurred vision may occur, especially upon awakening. Many patients are comforted by the gentle blow of a warm hair dryer toward the eyes for 5-10 minutes every morning to dehydrate the cornea. Symptoms of this condition usually develop after age 50. Corneal endothelial dystrophies are generally hereditary in nature.
